Notes to statement of Standalone Audited Financial Results for the Quarter and Year ended March 31, 2020

- The audited standalone financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors in their meeting held on June 29, 2020.
- In line with the provisions of Ind AS 108 Operating Segments, the operations of the Company fall primarily under Real Estate Development/Construction business, which is considered to be the only reportable segment.
- 3 Effective April 01, 2019, the company has adopted Ind AS AS 116 'Leases', applied to all leases contracts, except leases which are expiring less than 12 months on April 01, 2019 using the modified retrospective method along with the transition option to recognise Right To-Use Asset (ROU) at an amount equal to the lease liability. Accordingly, comparatives for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2019 have not been retrospectively adjusted. In Statement of profit and loss for the current period, the nature of expenses in respect of operating leases has changed from lease rent in previous periods to depreciation cost for the Righ To-Use Asset and finance costs for interest accrued on lease liability.
- The company has made provision of interest on principal refund amount payable to customers related to Jaipur project of Rs. 687.48 lakhs Lakhs up to the period ended March 31, 2020.
- 5 The figures of previous quarter/ year have been re-grouped, wherever necessary, for the purpose of comparision.
- The Company has considered the possible effects that may result from the pandemic relating to COVID-19 on the carrying amounts of receivables, unbilled revenues, goodwill and intangible assets. In developing the assumptions relating to the possible future uncertainties in the economic conditions because of this pandemic, the Company, as at the date of approval of these financial statements, has used internal and external sources of information on the expected future performance of the Company. The impact of COVID-19 on the Company's financial statements may differ from that estimated as at the date of approval of these financial statements.






